Feed my sheep

In our December Prayer Focus, we talked about how providing physical food is opening the door for the team to have conversations and provide emotional support in the rural communities we serve in Zimbabwe, as well as opportunities to share the Gospel.



On the 23rd December, the team began the distribution of an increased amount of 30 tonnes of mealie meal (more than double our usual monthly distribution) so that they could reach more people who would otherwise have gone hungry over Christmas. Phanuel, from our Bulawayo team, captured the response beautifully in a recent message:

What is exciting for me when we go for these distributions is the joy that some people express so unreservedly with great smiles and comments such as "sengivitholile i khisimusi" meaning 'I got Christmas!' and "sibonga ukukhunjulwa" which is 'thank you for remembering us'. Knowing where we are economically these words bring momentary sadness and instant joy all at once. The question being what if we did not come? What if no one cared? This is the rude awakening that we get all the time.

Pastor Bheki also wrote to update us on the spiritual impact of the work, saying:

The ministry is progressing well. This year I would like to reach more villages with the gospel and train more new leaders. We also thank you for the amount of mealie meal we received this time. We managed to reach more people. As we distribute mealie meal we find out that many people have challenges and do not have any one to tell. They tell us and we try by all means to help them where we are able to help and meet the challenge. It's an opportunity to serve with joy.
